Since then we have been following-up these contacts and incorporating them into our ministry. We expected to form three freshmen Bible studies, one upperclassmen study, and one grad student study. But there is so much interest, we are starting another upperclassmen study. People are turning out all over campus saying they want to be in an RUF Bible study. At the first Taylor dorm

study all but one person said they weren’t sure how committed they would be, but were just there to check it out. Well, they’re still coming out. One person who admitted being a weak Christian said, “I’m actually looking forward to this study. Scary, isn’t it?” And it looks like we may have 10 people in two of the studies. What makes all this so exciting is that only two years ago we had no dorm studies at all. The only way I can explain all this growth – God must be working powerfully among us!!

## Preaching and Praise

Our Tuesday night fellowship meeting has moved to a new level this year. The worship team practiced over the summer, added new songs, and is quite a fine group now. This has enhanced the whole tone of our meetings. We have expanded the musical part of the meetings and a more worshipful atmosphere is present. We have been praying about this for years, it’s wonderful to see these prayers answered.

I am speaking on the Sermon on the Mount this semester, giving the students a vision of the kind of life Jesus expects of those in His Kingdom. Every week we emphasize the impossibility of measuring up to Jesus’ standard on our own, and the good news that Jesus transforms those who trust in Him.

Last week several students told me how much they wished their friend had heard my message – how she needed to hear and believe that Jesus is the only way of salvation. Well, they didn’t just stop with regrets, but apparently went back and repeated the message to their friend. This morning I received an email that she became a Christian late last night! Leslie is heading up our major new initiative this year – a missions

trip to Mexico during spring break! Heather is secretary and helps us keep up with organizational details. She also plays keyboard on our worship team.

Looking at the sophomores, Jenna is the new social activities coordinator. Every Friday night we provide some fun alternative to drinking for anyone who wants to come. Some come once or twice a year, and others eventually get involved in the ministry. Either way, it's a ministry to the Lehigh community. Jenna is charged with improving this already fine program. Sam plays guitar on the worship team. Steve and Sarah are leading the first all-student led Bible study on campus. The last Ministry Team member is Hans, a grad student and the leader of the worship team.

## Summer Preparation

A vital component of the Ministry Team's success this year is the preparation we did this summer. For the first time, we spent six days in May at camp in Bible study, prayer, and learning principles of ministry. I taught the foundation of RUF ministry, principles of spiritual growth, the role of vision and strategy, and core activities for a campus ministry. We prayed and planned for ministry this year, and we learned more about each other. It's hard to describe how important those six days were in bonding the group together and equipping them for ministry.

Then some of us formed a summer Bible study which eventually swelled to 15 students! That was a great time to put into practice the things we had been learning. Christopher decided he wanted a high school Bible study, but no one at church could lead it – so he asked Leslie. She felt very stretched, but it was a great experience for her.

Ruth is teaching literature again at the Masters Academy of the Fine Arts in addition to homeschooling the younger three. This is Daniel's last year at Johns Hopkins, and he is starting think about whether to get a job or go to graduate school next year. He is co-leading a Bible study on campus this year. He seems completely immersed in campus life, but we enjoy seeing him at fellowship meetings and at church.

Christopher will be busy enough with his tenth grade

curriculum, but his many side projects (such as designing brochures for RUF) and active email correspondence keep him on the move. Stephen is in seventh grade this year and Benjamin is doing well in first. Both of them are excited about the start of the new soccer season.

Ruth's parents continue to be a source of help and encouragement next door. Her father had a bad fall this summer, but is recovering in time to teach a class in John's gospel and to resume Christopher's Latin lessons.

There are five sophomores who decided they wanted to get serious about following Christ and formed the core of the new upperclassmen Bible study. And there are the students who led their friend to Christ yesterday.
